No, not the spoken type, but REAL FOOD. Not easily obtained outside of Lancashire, but Morrison's sometime stock it, and good butchers – like Larkhall Butchers. There are basically 3 types: honeycomb; blanket; and leaf. The best and most tasty is the honeycomb – which looks like the word suggests. I have always eaten tripe raw as that preserves its taste and texture best. Just: wash, pat dry(ish) and cover with vinegar and pepper. Excellent cold with tomatoes and as part of a salad.
